SPECIAL CASH PRIZES.

For Grand Street Procession of Juvenile Temperance Societies.

- No. 1.—Decorated or Tableaux Cars.** First Prize, 40/-; Second Prize, 30/-; Third Prize, 20/-; Fourth Prize, 10/-; will be awarded for the best Decorated or Tableaux Cars in Procession. All cars drawn by a horse or horses are eligible.
- No. 2.—Decorated Perambulators or Mailcarts, containing children.** First Prize, 17/6; Second Prize, 12/6; Third Prize, 7/6; Fourth Prize, 5/-; will be awarded to the Members possessing the best Decorated Perambulators or Mailcarts in Procession containing Children.
- No. 3.—Decorated Doll Perambulators or Doll Mailcarts, containing Dolls.** First Prize, 15/-; Second Prize, 10/-; Third Prize, 7/6; Fourth Prize, 5/-; Fifth Prize, 3/6; Sixth Prize, 2/6; will be awarded to all members possessing the best Decorated Doll Perambulators or Doll Mailcarts in Procession containing Dolls.
- No. 4.—Decorated Bicycles.** First Prize, 17/6; Second Prize, 12/6; Third Prize 7/6; will be awarded to the Ladies or Gentlemen possessing the best Decorated Bicycles in Procession.
- No. 5.—Best Show in Procession.** First Prize, 25/-; Second Prize 15/-; Third Prize, 10/-; Fourth Prize, 6/-; will be given to the Society which makes the best Show in Procession with over 80 members.
- No. 6.—**First Prize, 25/-; Second Prize, 15/-; Third Prize 10/-; Fourth Prize 6/-; will be given to the Society which makes the best Show in Procession with under 80 members.

The Judges will have the power to withhold any Prizes in any class in which they consider the entries are not of sufficient merit, and their decision will be final.

All Decorations, except cars, to be taken to the pathway past the Lion in the Arboretum to be judged. The Horse Cars will be judged in the Station Yard and on Monks Road, after the Procession is over. The awards of the Judges will be posted outside the Committee Room at the Arboretum Lodge.

The Prize Winners in all classes (except No. 1), will parade in the Arboretum as directed by the Committee, after receiving their Award Cards.

On receipt of entries, each Exhibit will be given a number, which must be placed in a prominent position for the judges to see.
