**Dr. HAROLD C. HIND.**

Dr. Hind has on many occasions officiated as adjudicator at the Belle Vue Brass Band and Military Contests, including nine times at the Belle Vue "September". He transferred to Cardiff several years ago to take over an important position in connection with the musical activities of the City, a position he has held with great success. Dr. Hind has recently been entrusted by the Ministry of Education and Cardiff Education Committee with the creation of the National College of Music and Drama to be housed in Cardiff Castle, presented to the City by the Marquis of Bute. The College is opening under Dr. Hind's direction, on September 19th, and will provide tuition in every branch of music and drama, with an ultimate capacity of over a thousand students.

**Mr. FRANK WRIGHT.**

Frank Wright is acknowledged to be one of the foremost brass band authorities of our time. He has adjudicated at almost every important Band Festival in the world, including the Championships of Australia, New Zealand and Scotland, the Royal National Eisteddfod of Wales, at Belle Vue (Manchester), and at the Royal Albert Hall, London.

He leaves England next month to visit Australia where he will again adjudicate the band championships of that country.

He is the Musical Director to the London County Council (Parks Department) and Professor of Brass and Military Band Conducting and Scoring at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, London.

**Mr. TOM F. ATKINSON.**

Tom F. Atkinson is very well known throughout the Brass Band world for his organising abilities and enthusiasm. Like many more brass bandmen his early career was with the Salvation Army, during which time he played for several bands and for ten years was Bandmaster of the Great Horton Salvation Army Band. He is now Brass Instrumental teacher for both the City of Leeds and the City of Bradford Education Authorities, visiting various schools and actually teaching between 100 and 120 boys each week. He has three sons all expert instrumentalists. During the past few years he has fulfilled many adjudicating appointments including Belle Vue and other Contests in all parts of Britain.

## TEST PIECE:

**"RHAPSODY IN BRASS"**

JOHN DEAN GOFFIN

(New Zealand)



John Dean Goffin

It is a remarkable complex on life that a wonderful musical composition should be created amidst desolation, strife, and death. Music, the universal language, rears itself far above the destructive elements, and 'Rhapsody in Brass' is a shining example of this.

The Test Piece for to-day's contest was originated in Syria in January, 1942, where the composer was serving with the New Zealand division in the Middle East.

It was interrupted by the rapid transfer of the division to the Western Desert to counter Rommel's drive into Egypt.

The Test Piece was completed in Egypt, in June, 1942, and the final allegro was written during one week-end while on leave at the Base.

The whole composition was performed one week later by the Fourth New Zealand Brigade Band at the "Music for All" Club, Cairo.

With the exception of five years service with the New Zealand Division as a Military Bandmaster, John Dean Goffin's whole musical career has been as a Salvation Army Bandmaster. "Rhapsody in Brass" was composed by him at the age of 25 years. He holds the degree of Dip. Mus. (Cantab.) and this year will finalise his Mus. Bac. degree.

His father is the well known composer and conductor, Brigadier H. C. Goffin.

The new work is in three movements, well contrasted, and making considerable technical demands upon every player in the band. The first movement is full of rhythmic life and contrasting dynamic effects; the second expressive but never morbid or over sentimental. The third movement has not, perhaps, the same musical value as the preceding, but it is brilliant and exciting.

The whole is well laid out for the band, every section being given some prominence at one time or another, whilst cornet, horn and euphonium soloists have plenty to keep them occupied.

◊ We know already that bandmen like playing this music, and the audience at to-day's Contest can be assured of a good day's listening.

The Rhapsody is we understand to be used as the Test Piece for the New Zealand Championship.
